## WARNING - BEFORE OPERATING THE UNIT, PLEASE CAREFULLY READ AND UNDERSTAND THIS DOCUMENT.

- · Internal components are very sensitive. Do not shake, drop, or overload unit.
- · Handle unit with care, treating it as the sensitive instrument it is.
- If spilled powder gets inside unit, do not operate. Call Hornady Customer Service at 1-800-338-3220.



## **TIPS TO IMPROVE PERFORMANCE**

- Fluctuations in temperature, even of a few degrees, can cause scale readings to vary.
   While scale can be used immediately, optimal performance will occur after unit has warmed up for 5-15 minutes.
- Always place the scale on a flat, level, and stable surface when in operation.
- Electrical interference can cause scale readings to vary. Keep other electronic devices (power strips, florescent lights, motors, radios, phones, etc.) away from scale when in operation.
- Do not let a fan, air conditioner, heater, or open window blow on scale.
- Using clear cover over powder pan will improve accuracy and lessen effects of outside variables.

## **KEYPAD BUTTON FUNCTIONS**

**ON/ OFF** (mechanical button): Tap to turn on. Hold for three seconds to turn off.

CALIBRATE: Hold for three seconds to calibrate.

**MODE**: Tap to toggle units (G, GN, OZ). Hold for three seconds to enter "Mode Menu." See "Mode Menu" section for operation.

**PRINT**: Tap to output weighing data. Can only be used when connected with included RS232 cable to a computer. See "Outputting Data" section for operation.

**SAMPLE**: Tap to round last decimal place. Hold for three seconds to turn beeps off.

**ZERO:** Tap to zero the scale

CAL + ZERO + ON/OFF: Factory Reset

## **CALIBRATION**

- For optimal performance, turn unit on and allow 5-15 minutes to warm up.
- Verify powder pan has been removed, and that the metal scale plate is empty.
- Press CALIBRATE for three seconds until the unit displays "CAL---".
- When 10.00g is flashing, place the 10g weight on the center of the scale plate. The unit
  will show "----" while calibrating the 10g weight.
- When 10.00g appears again, remove the weight.
- When 50.00g is flashing, place the 50g weight on the center of the scale plate. The unit
  will show "----" while calibrating the 50g weight.
- When 50.00g appears again, remove the weight.
- After calibration the unit will briefly display "PASS" before returning to normal operation.

#### **MODE MENU**

Holding the **MODE** button for three seconds will enter the mode menu. The **MODE** menu has the following options:

- SETTINGS: the settings menu allows you to set the scale speed and change the units being used. (See Settings section)
- COMPARE: the compare function allows you to set a nominal weight, along with a
  tolerance range, and easily compare items to your acceptable range.
  (See COMPARE section)
- PERCENT: the percent function allows you to set a nominal weight and compare items to
  your acceptable weight in percentage form. (See Percent section)
- PIECE: the piece function allows you to count the number of parts in a batch based off the weight of a small sample size. (See Piece section)

Use the following buttons at any time in the **MODE** menu:

- > SAMPLE: tap to toggle through menu options forward
- > **PRINT**: tap to toggle through menu options backwards
- > ZERO: tap to select or deselect option
- > CALIBRATE: tap to return to the main menu
- > MODE: tap to return to the main weighing screen

#### **SETTINGS** (select with ZERO button)

- The settings menu offers two options:
  - > SPEED: this is displayed as SENSITIVITY on the main weighing screen.
    - » HI: the most sensitive setting for the scale, and the most likely to be affected by external elements. Will also have the fastest response time.
    - » LOW: the least sensitive setting for the scale, and the least likely to be affected by external elements. Will also have the slowest response time.
  - UNITS: This allows for more unit options that are not found when tapping the mode button. Once a unit is selected using the zero button it will display when tapping through the mode options for units. These units will also need to be deselected in the units menu to be removed from the mode button toggling.
    - » CT, LB, OZT, MOM, dWT, T, MS.

#### COMPARE (select with ZERO button)

- > Use "Sample" button to toggle through options forward
- > Use "Print" button to toggle through options backwards. (options: ON, OFF)
- Use "Zero" button to select option and enter the options menu.
- Use "Calibrate" to return to Main Menu.
- Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to standard weighing or last used weighing mode.

#### • ON (select with ZERO button, double tap ZERO to enter the COMPARE – ON settings)

- Use "Sample" button to toggle through options forward
- Use "Print" button to toggle through options backwards. (options: NOM WT, TOL HI, TOL LOW)
- > Use "Zero" button to select and enter options menu
- > Use "Calibrate" to return to Compare Menu
- Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to or start comparing.

#### • NOM WT (select with ZERO button)

- > Tap and Hold "Zero" to use current weight on scale for nominal weight
- > Use "Sample" button to toggle through place holders forward
- > Use "Print" button to toggle through place holders backwards
- > Tap "Zero" button to edit place holder
  - » Use "Sample" button to toggle through selected place holder (0-9)
  - » Use "Print" button to toggle through selected place holder (9-0)
  - » Tap "Zero" again to select place holder value
- > Use "Calibrate" when finished, or at any time to return to COMPARE- ON menu
- Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to or start comparing

#### • TOL HI (select with ZERO button)

- > This number is the number of units away from your nominal weight you are allowing.
  - » Example: 10g +/- .4g | Tol HI: .4g
  - » Use "Sample" button to toggle through place holders left to right
  - » Use "Print" button to toggle through place holders right to left
  - » Tap "Zero" button to edit place holder
    - Use "Sample" button to toggle through selected place holder (0-9)
    - Use "Print" button to toggle through selected place holder (9-0)
    - Tap "Zero" again to select place holder value
  - » Use "Calibrate" when finished, or at any time to return to COMPARE- ON menu
  - » Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to or start comparing

#### • TOL LOW (select with ZERO button)

- > This number is the number of units away from your nominal weight you are allowing.
  - » Example: 10g +/- .4g | Tol LOW: .4g
  - » Use "Sample" button to toggle through place holders left to right
  - » Use "Print" button to toggle through place holders right to left
  - » Tap "Zero" button to edit place holder
    - Use "Sample" button to toggle through selected place holder (0-9)
    - Use "Print" button to toggle through selected place holder (9-0)
    - · Tap "Zero" again to select place holder value
  - » Use "Calibrate" when finished, or at any time to return to COMPARE- ON menu
  - » Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to or start comparing

#### • OFF (select with ZERO button)

> Turn off Compare function.

#### **PERCENT** (select with ZERO button)

- > Use "Sample" button to toggle through options forward
- > Use "Print" button to toggle through options backwards. (options: ON,OFF)
- > Use "Zero" button to select option and enter the options menu.
- > Use "Calibrate" to return to Main Menu
- Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to standard weighing or last used weighing mode.

#### • ON (select with ZERO button, double tap ZERO to enter the PERCENT – ON menu)

- > Tap and Hold "Zero" to use current weight on scale for 100% weight
- > Use "Sample" button to toggle through place holders forward
- > Use "Print" button to toggle through place holders backwards
- > Tap "Zero" button to edit place holder
- Use "Sample" button to toggle through selected place holder (0-9).
- Use "Print" button to toggle through selected place holder (9-0)
  - » Tap "Zero" again to select place holder value
- > Use "Calibrate" when finished, or at any time to return to Percent Menu
- > Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to or start comparing

#### • OFF (Select with ZERO button)

> Turn off Percent function.

### PIECE (select with ZERO button)

- > Use "Sample" button to toggle through options forward.
- > Use "Print" button to toggle through options backwards. (options: ON,OFF)
- > Use "Zero" button to select option and enter the options menu.
- Use "Calibrate" to return to Main Menu.
- Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to standard weighing or last used weighing mode.

#### • ON (Select with ZERO button, double tap to enter the Count menu)

- Use "Sample" button to toggle through options forward.
- > Use "Print" button to toggle through options backwards. (options: 5,10,15)
- > Use "Zero" button to select option & Enter the options menu.
- Use "Calibrate" to return to Piece Menu
- Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to standard weighing or last used weighing mode.

#### • 5 (Select with ZERO button)

- > Tap and Hold "Zero" to use current weight on scale for nominal weight
- Use "Sample" button to toggle through place holders forward.
- > Use "Print" button to toggle through place holders backwards
- > Tap "Zero" button to edit place holder
  - » Use "Sample" button to toggle through selected place holder (0-9)!
  - » Use "Print" button to toggle through selected place holder (9-0)
  - » Tap "Zero" again to select place holder value
- > Use "Calibrate" when finished, or at any time to return to PC-ON Menu
- > Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to or start comparing

#### • 10 (Select with ZERO button)

- > Tap and Hold "Zero" to use current weight on scale for nominal weight
- > Use "Sample" button to toggle through place holders forward.
- > Use "Print" button to toggle through place holders backwards
- > Tap "Zero" button to edit place holder
  - » Use "Sample" button to toggle through selected place holder (0-9).
  - » Use "Print" button to toggle through selected place holder (9-0)
  - » Tap "Zero" again to select place holder value
- > Use "Calibrate" when finished, or at any time to return to PC-ON Menu
- > Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to or start comparing

#### 15 (Select with ZERO button)

- > Tap and Hold "Zero" to use current weight on scale for nominal weight
- > Use "Sample" button to toggle through place holders forward.
- > Use "Print" button to toggle through place holders backwards
- > Tap "Zero" button to edit place holder
  - » Use "Sample" button to toggle through selected place holder (0-9.
  - » Use "Print" button to toggle through selected place holder (9-0)
  - » Tap "Zero" again to select place holder value
- > Use "Calibrate" when finished, or at any time to return to PC-ON Menu
- > Use "Mode" at any time to exit all menus and return to or start comparing

#### • Off (Select with ZERO button)

> Exit menu and return to standard weighing screen

## **OUTPUTTING DATA**

The Hornady Precision Lab Scale has the ability to output the weighing data into the spreadsheet program of choice. To do this:

- Plug the included RS232 cable into the back of the scale
  - > Plug the USB side of this cable into the computer
- Open a spreadsheet
- Place an item on the scale and tap print
  - > This will print out the value displayed on the screen to the spreadsheet
  - A "P" will be displayed on the screen once the print button is tapped, the P will be displayed until the unit is removed and the scale returns to zero
